The water committee evaluated the increase costs of chemicals and funding necessary for anticipated plant improvements and is recommending the 3% rate increase as provided for in the 2021-2022 budget. The rate would increase the base amount for water service for the first 134 cubic feet by 35 cents per month from \$11.51 to \$11.86 and the price per additional 100 cubic feet would increase by 22 cents from \$7.22 to \$7.44. Attached is a graph showing the increase by amount of water used.
- F. Consider approval of second reading to increase wastewater rates by 5½ %. The Wastewater Committee and Finance committee reviewed the fee structure needed to provide the necessary funding for a \$10-12 million dollar upgrade of the wastewater treatment plant to meet the Department of Natural Resources discharge requirements. The annual increase would be 5½% for each year for the next 5 years. The base rate would increase for sewer service in the first year by 74 cents per month from \$13.38 to \$14.12. The price per 100 cubic feet would increase by 31 cents from \$5.65 to \$5.96. Attached is a graph showing the increase by amount of sewer used along with the 5-year fee schedule.

CONSULTING AGREEMENT

This Consulting Agreement, (the "Agreement") is entered into ______, 2021 by and between the City of Jefferson, Iowa (the "Client" and Piper Sandler & Co. ("Piper"). This Agreement will serve as our mutual agreement with respect to the terms and conditions of our engagement herein, effective on the date this Agreement is executed (the "Effective Date").

I. Scope of Services.

(A) Services to be provided.

Piper is engaged by the Client to assist with the creation, review and presentation to City of debt management and financial policies.

- (B) **Scope of Services.** The Client and Piper intend and agree that the Scope of Services to be provided shall consist of the following:
 - 1. Review drafts of debt management and financial policies
 - 2. Provide suggested edits to the debt management and financial policies
 - 3. Attend meetings with the Client, as requested
 - 4. Provide examples of other communities debt management and financial policies

II. Limitations on Scope of Services.

The Scope of Services is subject to the following limitations:

The Scope of Services is limited solely to the services described herein and is subject to limitations set forth within the descriptions of the Scope of Services. Any duties created by this Agreement do not extend beyond the Scope of Services or to any other contract, agreement, relationship, or understanding of any nature between the Client and Piper.

The Scope of Services does not include evaluating advice or recommendations received by you from third parties.

III. Amending Scope of Services.

The Scope of Services may be changed only by written amendment or supplement. The parties agree to amend or supplement the Scope of Services promptly to reflect any material changes or additions to the Scope of Services.

IV. Compensation.

Compensation is based on an hourly fee of \$250/hour.

V. IRMA Matters.

Client will not designate Piper as its independent registered municipal advisor ("IRMA") for purposes of SEC Rule 15Ba1-1(d)(3)(vi) (the "IRMA exemption").

VI. Expenses.

Piper will be responsible for all of Piper's out-of-pocket expenses unless otherwise agreed upon or if travel is directed by Client. If travel is directed by the Client, Client will reimburse Piper for their expenses.

VII. Term of Agreement.

The term of this Agreement shall begin on the date first listed herein, and ends upon the adoption by the Client's governing body of the debt management and financial policies, or if not adopted, the abandonment by the Client of the process to adopt debt management and financial policies.

This agreement may be terminated by either party, and when terminated, Client shall pay Piper for time served pursuant to this Agreement.

The provisions of Sections titled: "Compensation", "Expenses", "Limitation of Liability", "Consent to Jurisdiction", "Choice of Law", and "Waiver of Jury Trial" shall survive termination of this Agreement.

XIV. Counterparts; Severability.

This Agreement may be executed in two or more separate counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, but all of which together shall constitute one and the same instrument. Any term or provision of this Agreement which is invalid or unenforceable in any jurisdiction shall, as to such jurisdiction, be ineffective to the extent of such invalidity or unenforceability without rendering invalid or unenforceable the remaining terms and provisions of this Agreement or affecting the validity or enforceability of any of the terms or provisions of this Agreement in any other jurisdiction.

XV. Waiver of Jury Trial.

THE PARTIES EACH HEREBY AGREES TO WAIVE ANY RIGHT TO A TRIAL BY JURY WITH RESPECT TO ANY CLAIM, COUNTERCLAIM OR ACTION ARISING OUT OF OR IN CONNECTION WITH THIS AGREEMENT OR THE TRANSACTIONS CONTEMPLATED HEREBY OR THE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN THE PARTIES. PARTIES AGREE TO WAIVE CONSEQUENTIAL AND PUNITIVE DAMAGES.

XVI. No Third Party Beneficiary.

This Agreement is made solely for the benefit of the parties and their respective successors and permitted assigns. Nothing in this Agreement, express or implied, is intended to confer on any person, other than the parties and their respective successors and permitted assigns, any rights, remedies, obligations or liabilities under or by reason of this Agreement.

XVII. Authority.

The undersigned represents and warrants that they have full legal authority to execute this Agreement on behalf of the Client. The following individual(s) at the Client have the authority to direct Piper's performance of its activities under this Agreement:



A RESOLUTION PROPOSING SALE OF PROPERTY LOCATED AT 705 W. ADAMS AND SETTING PUBLIC HEARING

WHEREAS, the City of Jefferson previously acquired ownership of property located at 705 W. Adams, in Jefferson, legally described as follows:

Lot 3, in Block 7, in Lincoln Place Addition to the City of Jefferson, Greene County, Iowa; and

WHEREAS, the City has received from Think Big, LLC, a proposal to purchase the Property pursuant to the terms and provisions of a Real Estate Purchase and Sale Agreement (the "Purchase and Sale Agreement") that is now before this Council; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that it is in the best interests of the City of Jefferson that such sale be made; and

WHEREAS, before the city may proceed with such proposal it is necessary that notice of this proposal be published and that public hearing be held in accordance with the Iowa Code.

NOW, THEREFORE, It Is Resolved by the City Council of the City of Jefferson, Iowa, as follows:

- Section 1. The City of Jefferson proposes to sell the Property to Think Big, LLC, for the sum of \$500.00 in accordance with the terms and provisions of the Purchase and Sale Agreement now before the Council.
- Section 2. The City Council shall meet at the Municipal Center in Jefferson, Iowa, on June 22, 2021, at 5:30 p.m., at which time and place a public hearing shall be held on the proposal, at which hearing all local residents who appear shall be given an opportunity to express their views for or against the proposal.

ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF JEFFERSON, IOWA, 2017, BY AMENDING PROVISIONS PERTAINING TO ANIMAL PROTECTION AND CONTROL

Be it enacted by the City Council of Jefferson, Iowa:

SECTION 1. Section Amended. Section 55.01 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Jefferson, Iowa, 2017, is repealed and the following adopted in lieu thereof:

55.01 DEFINITIONS. The following terms are defined for use in this chapter.

- 1. "Advertise" means to present a commercial message in any medium including but not limited to print, radio, television, sign, display, label, tag or articulation.
- 2. "Animal" means a nonhuman vertebrate.

(Code of Iowa, Sec. 717B.1)

- 3. "At large" means off the premises of the owner and not under the control of a competent person, restrained within a motor vehicle, or housed in a veterinary hospital or kennel.
- 4. "Business" means any enterprise relating to any of the following:
 - A. The sale or offer for sale of goods or services.
 - B. A recruitment for employment or membership in an organization.
 - C. A solicitation to make an investment.
 - D. An amusement or entertainment activity.
- 5. "Caregiver" means the person responsible for a feral cat colony.
- 6. "Fair" means any of the following:
 - A. The annual fair and exposition held by the Iowa State Fair Board pursuant to Chapter 173 of the Code of Iowa or any fair event conducted by a fair under the provisions of Chapter 174 of the Code of Iowa.
 - B. An exhibition of agricultural or manufactured products.
 - C. An event for operation of amusement rides or devices or concession booths.
- 6. "Feral cat" means any wild or untamed cat. A feral cat is not a stray cat.
- 7. "Feral cat colony" means a group of homeless, wild or untamed cates living or growing together.

- 8. "Game" means a "game of chance" or "game of skill" as defined in Section 99B.1 of the Code of Iowa.
- 9. "Illegal animal" means:
 - A. Badgers, wolverines, weasels, skunk and mink;
 - B. Raccoons;
 - C. Bats;
 - D. Scorpions;
 - E. Any dog which has attached a human being or domestic animal one or more times, without provocation.
- 10. "Livestock" means an animal belonging to the bovine, caprine, equine, ovine or porcine species, ostriches, rheas and emus; farm deer as defined in Section 170.1 of the Code of Iowa; or poultry.

(Code of Iowa, Sec. 717.1)

- 11. "Nuisance" means disturbing the peace by habitually or continually crying or screaming, or the habitual and significant destruction, desecration, or soiling of property against the owner or possessor of the property.
- 12. "Owner" means any person owning, keeping, sheltering or harboring an animal.
- 13. "Pet" means a living dog, cat or an animal normally maintained in a small tank or cage in or near a residence, including but not limited to a rabbit, gerbil, hamster, mouse, parrot, canary, mynah, finch, tropical fish, goldfish, snake, turtle, gecko or iguana.
- 14. "Vicious animal" means and includes:
 - A. Any dog with a history, tendency or disposition to attack, to cause injury or to otherwise endanger the safety of human beings or domestic animals;
 - B. Any dog that snaps, attempts to bite a human being or domestic animal, or manifests a disposition to snap or bite;
 - C. Any dog that, unprovoked, chases or approaches anyone in a menacing fashion off the owner's property;
 - D. Any dog that has been trained for dog fighting, animal fighting or animal baiting or is owned or kept for such purposes; or
 - E. Any dog trained to attack human beings, upon command or spontaneously in response to human activities, except dogs owned by and under the control of the police department, the county sheriff, a law enforcement agency of the state or of the United States or a branch of the armed forces of the United States.

A dog shall not be deemed to be "vicious" if the threat or injury: (a) is caused by a person who is assaulting the dog's owner, committing a willful trespass or tort upon the owner's premises, or provoking, tormenting, or abusing the dog or can be shown to have done so repeatedly at other times, (b) is a response to pain or injury, or is to protect itself, its kennel, its offspring, or its owner's property, or (c) is inflicted by a dog owned by a law enforcement agency in the line of duty.

- SECTION 2. Sections Added. The Code of Ordinances of the City of Jefferson, Iowa, 2017, is amended and the following Sections 55.23 thru 55.26 are adopted and added therein:
 - **55.23 FERAL CAT COLONY.** It is unlawful for any person to maintain a feral cat colony unless the colony is a managed colony in which food, water, and shelter are provided by a caregiver in conjunction with the implementation of the Trap-Neuter-Return (TNR) Program as set forth in section 55.25 of this Chapter.
 - **55.24 MANAGED FERAL CATS.** The City of Jefferson, in order to encourage the stabilization of the feral cat population in the City, shall implement the Trap-Neuter-Return (TNR) Program as follows:
 - 1. Live-trap any free-roaming cat in a humane manner,
 - 2. Have the cat surgically altered, ear-notched (if feral), microchipped (if feral and if so determined by the City), and vaccinated against rabies, and
 - 3. Give a written report annually to the Jefferson City Council on the following:
 - A. Number of colonies and location with the city limits;
 - B. Total number of cats in colonies;
 - C. Number of cats and kittens spayed and neutered pursuant to the TNR program; and
 - D. Number of cats and kittens placed in permanent homes.

55.25 MAINTAINING A FERAL CAT COLONY. Feral cat colony caregivers shall:

- 1. Take responsibility for feeding and watering the cat colony regularly through the year, while ensuring that the food storage area(s) are secure from insect, rodent, and other vermin attraction and harborage.
- 2. Work to sterilize, vaccinate and ear-notch all adult cats that can be captured. Implanting a microchip is recommended; and
- 3. Remove droppings, spoiled food, and other waste from the premises as often as necessary, and at least every seven (7) days, to prevent odor, insect or rodent attracting or breeding, or any other nuisance.
- 4. Provide contact information in the event that complaints are received by the City of Jefferson concerning management of the colony.

- 5. Register the feral cat colony with the City of Jefferson.
- 6. Obtain written permission of the owner of any property, to which the Caregiver requires access to provide colony care.
- 7. In the event kittens are born to a colony cat, the Caregiver shall take reasonable steps likely to result in the removal of the kittens in homes or foster homes for the purpose of subsequent permanent placement.
- 8. Obtaining proper medical attention to any colony cat that appears to need it.
- 9. Provide written reports to the City of Jefferson covering six month periods, due April 15 (reporting months October through March) and October 15 (reporting months April through September) of each year, on forms prepared by and provided by the City of Jefferson.

55.26 ORDINANCE ENFORCEMENT. The City of Jefferson shall have the following rights:

- 1. The right to seize or remove cats from a colony that have not been vaccinated against rabies and which are demonstrating signs of the disease.
- 2. The right to seize or remove cats from a colony that is creating a nuisance as defined above and the caregiver has been given 48 hours to remove and relocate and has failed to do so.
- 3. The right to seize or remove a colony of cats when the feral cat colony caregiver regularly fails to comply with the requirements of 55.25 and replacement/substitute cannot be located within 30 days of notice to the caregiver..

SECTION 3. Severability. If any section, provision or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 4. When effective. This ordinance shall be in effect after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law.
