CITY OF Jefferson RESOLUTION APPROVING THE FEDERAL RECREATIONAL TRAILS APPLICATION

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL, JEFFERSON, AND IOWA:

WHEREAS, The City of Jefferson is interested in the development of a recreational trail in Jefferson for the enjoyment of the citizenry of the city, the surrounding area, and the entire State of Iowa; and,

WHEREAS, The City of Jefferson has determined that the Daubendiek Trail is an essential corporate purpose, which will foster economic and community development, and,

WHEREAS, Federal Recreational Trail funds are sought to provide financial assistance for the development of such facilities.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the City of Jefferson that the Federal Rec Trails application be authorized and approved; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City of Jefferson will make application to the Iowa Department of Transportation and maintain the trail, once completed, for a minimum of 20 years,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City of Jefferson certifies to the following:

- 1. That it is in complete accord with the grant proposal and that it will carry out the development in the manner described in the proposal and any plans and specifications attached thereto unless prior approval for any change has been received from the IDOT.
- 2. That it has the ability and intention to finance its share of the cost of the project and that the project will be operated and maintained at the expense of the county for public recreational use.
- 3. That it will maintain adequate financial records on the proposed action to substantiate claims for cost-sharing.
