

ORDINANCE NO. 569

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF JEFFERSON, IOWA, 2008, BY AMENDING PROVISIONS PERTAINING TO NO PARKING DURING SNOW REMOVAL

Be it enacted by the City Council of Jefferson, Iowa:

SECTION 1. Amendment. The Code of Ordinances of the City of Jefferson, Iowa, 2008, is hereby amended by repealing Section 69.10 and adopting the following in its place:


69.10 SNOW REMOVAL. No person shall park, abandon or leave unattended any vehicle on any public street, alley, or City-owned off-street parking area from the time there has been an accumulation of one-half inch of snow until the snow has ceased to fall and has been removed or plowed from said street, alley or parking area. The provisions of this section shall apply only between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. for the following streets:

1. Washington Street from Elm Street to Chestnut Street;
2. State Street from Elm Street to Locust Street;
3. Lincoln Way from Elm Street to the Raccoon River Valley Recreation Trail crossing;
4. Harrison Street from Elm Street to the alley between Chestnut Street and Locust Street;
5. Vine Street from Washington Street to Madison Street;
6. Chestnut Street from Washington Street to Monroe Street;
7. Wilson Avenue from Washington Street to Monroe Street;
8. Locust Street from State Street to Lincoln Way.

SECTION 2. Severability. If any section, provision or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 3. When effective. This ordinance shall be in effect after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law.


