A RESOLUTION APPROVING PURCHASE AGREEMENT FOR PROPERTY AT 307 NORTH WILSON AVE

WHEREAS, a real estate purchase and sale agreement (the "**Purchase Agreement**") providing for the acquisition of property owned by John Copeland at 307 N. Wilson Ave. and described as follows (the "**Property**"):

Lot 19, Except the South 30 feet, and Except the East 27 feet of the S ½ of Lot 19; and Lot 20, Except the South 30 feet; and the W ½ of the N ½ of the vacated alley between Lots 18 and 19; all in Block 5, Original Town (now City) of Jefferson, Greene County, Iowa;

is before this Council, which Purchase Agreement has been signed by the Seller and by the Mayor on behalf of the City, subject to this Council's approval; and

WHEREAS, the Purchase Agreement provides for the transfer of the Property to the City in as is-where is condition for \$5,000.00 with the Seller to assume abstracting costs; the purchase price to be prorated at closing based on the outstanding taxes which will be paid by the City either at closing out of the purchase price or prior to closing if closing occurs after May 31, 2022; and which is subject to the right of the City to conduct inspections on the Property, including environmental inspections, before accepting the Property; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined that the acquisition of this property would be in conformity with the City's goal of encouraging and assisting with the preservation and rehabilitation of properties and beautification of the City; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that it is in the best interests of the City of Jefferson that the City proceed with the acquisition of the Property in accordance with the terms of the proposed Purchase Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, It Is Resolved by the City Council of the City of Jefferson, Iowa, as follows:

- Section 1. The Purchase Agreement providing for the acquisition of the Property is approved.
- Section 2. The Mayor, City Administrator and City Clerk are authorized to take such further action as may be necessary to carry out the intent and purpose of this resolution.
- Section 3. All resolutions and orders, or parts thereof, in conflict herewith are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby repealed, and this resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its adoption and approval.

REAL ESTATE PURCHASE AGREEMENT

This Agreement is dated May 13, 2022 and entered into by and between John S. Copeland, 938 Hackey Ave., Des Moines, IA 50315 ("Seller"), and the City of Jefferson, an Iowa municipal corporation, 220 N. Chestnut, Jefferson, IA 50129 ("Buyer").

The parties agree as follows:

1. PROPERTY. The undersigned Buyer hereby offers to purchase, and the undersigned Seller agrees to sell, certain real property situated in Jefferson, Iowa, locally known as 307 N. Wilson Ave., Jefferson, Iowa, and legally described as:

Lot 19, Except the South 30 feet, and Except the East 27 feet of the S ½ of Lot 19; and Lot 20, Except the South 30 feet; and the W ½ of the N ½ of the vacated alley between Lots 18 and 19; all in Block 5, Original Town (now city) of Jefferson, Greene County, Iowa;

together with all easements and servient estates appurtenant thereto and all improvements situated thereon, subject to easements for public utilities and streets, subject to zoning restrictions, and subject to such other easements, covenants, restrictions, and reservations as Buyer may approve, all of which is referred to as the "Property."

- 2. PURCHASE PRICE. The Purchase Price shall be \$5,000.00, which shall be paid to the Seller at closing.
- 3. REAL ESTATE TAXES. Seller shall be responsible for all unpaid real estate taxes and interest thereon, if any, as of the date of closing. Buyer will be responsible for real estate taxes commencing with the payment due in October 2022, and subsequent thereto.
- 4. SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS. Responsibility for all charges for solid waste removal, sewage and maintenance that are attributable to Seller's possession, including those for which assessments arise after closing, shall be assumed by Buyer. Buyer shall pay all other special assessments or installments not payable by Seller.
- 5. RISK OF LOSS AND INSURANCE. Seller shall bear the risk of loss or damage to the Property prior to closing or possession, whichever first occurs. Seller agrees to maintain existing insurance coverage, if any, and Buyer may purchase additional insurance. In the event of substantial damage or destruction prior to closing, this Agreement shall be null and void; provided, however, Buyer shall have the option to complete the closing and receive insurance proceeds regardless of the extent of damages. The Property shall be deemed substantially damaged or destroyed if it cannot be restored to its present condition on or before the closing date.
- 6. POSSESSION AND CLOSING. If Buyer and Seller timely perform all obligations, possession of the Property shall be delivered to Buyer at Buyer's discretion following the completion of its due diligence under this Agreement, and any adjustments of rent, insurance,

interest and all charges attributable to the Seller's possession shall be made as of the date of possession. Closing shall occur after the approval of title by Buyer and vacation of the Property by Seller, but prior to possession by Buyer. If possession is given on a day other than closing, the parties shall make a separate agreement with adjustments as of the date of possession. This transaction shall be considered closed upon the filing of the title transfer documents and receipt of all funds due at closing from Buyer under the Agreement. Notwithstanding anything in this Agreement, at the option of the Buyer, closing may be conditioned upon the Jefferson City Council voting in favor of the Buyer's acquisition of the Property.

- 7. FIXTURES. Included with the Property shall be all fixtures that integrally belong to, are specifically adapted to or are a part of the real estate, whether attached or detached.
- 8. CONDITION OF PROPERTY. The Property as of the date of this Agreement, including buildings, grounds, and all improvements, will be preserved by the Seller in its present condition until possession, ordinary wear and tear excepted.

Seller agrees to permit Buyer to inspect the Property at its discretion following the execution of this Agreement up to and including the date of closing. Seller's agreement to permit Buyer to take samples and bring in third-parties for purposes of inspecting the structure located on the Property. Buyer agrees that it shall be liable for damage caused to the Property while it is inspecting the Property. Seller shall provide Buyer a copy of keys to the Property so that a timeline inspection can occur, and Buyer expressly warrants that it shall not make copies of said keys to the Property until closing has been held.

Buyer may, at its sole expense, have the Property inspected by a person or persons of their choice to determine if there are any structural, mechanical, plumbing, electrical, environmental, or other deficiencies. Buyer may notify in writing the Seller of any deficiency. In the event that deficiencies are found by the Buyer prior to closing, in lieu of moving forward with completion of the transaction, it may notify Seller in writing that this Agreement is thereby null and void.

Seller shall remove all personal property they desire to keep and retain from the Property prior to Closing. All parties hereto understand that the structure situated on the Property is to be razed in furtherance of city beautification, and therefore the Seller shall take notice that any personal property needs to be removed within the aforementioned timeframe or risk being forever destroyed in the razing of the structure.

9. ABSTRACT AND TITLE. Seller shall obtain an abstract of title to the Property, or Report of Title at its option, continued through the date of this Agreement, and deliver it to Buyer's attorney for examination. It shall show marketable title in Seller in conformity with this Agreement, Iowa law, and title standards of the Iowa State Bar Association. The Seller shall make every reasonable effort to promptly perfect title. If closing is delayed due to Seller's inability to provide marketable title, this Agreement shall continue in force and effect until either party rescinds the Agreement after giving ten days written notice to the other party. If the Seller rescinds the Agreement, he shall immediately repay to Buyer any funds provided to Seller under this Agreement. The abstract shall continue to be the property of Buyer both prior to and after closing.

10. SURVEY. Buyer may, at Buyer's expense prior to closing, have the property surveyed and certified by a registered land surveyor. If the survey shows an encroachment on the Property or if any improvements located on the Property encroach on lands of others, the encroachments shall be treated as a title defect.

11. ENVIRONMENTAL MATTERS.

- a. Seller warrants to the best of his knowledge and belief that there are no abandoned wells, solid waste disposal sites, hazardous wastes or substances, or underground storage tanks located on the Property, the Property does not contain levels of radon gas, asbestos, or urea-formaldehyde foam insulation which require remediation under current governmental standards, and Seller has done nothing to contaminate the Property with hazardous wastes or substances. Seller warrants that the Property is not subject to any local, state, or federal judicial or administrative action, investigation or order, as the case may be, regarding wells, solid waste disposal sites, hazardous wastes or substances, or underground storage tanks. Seller shall also provide Buyer with a properly executed Groundwater Hazard Statement showing no wells, private burial sites, solid waste disposal sites, private sewage disposal system, hazardous waste and underground storage tanks on the Property, if required by law. Further, Seller shall indemnify and hold harmless Buyer from any liability stemming from Seller's ownership of the Property, including but not limited to penalties and costs associated with environmental laws and regulations.
- b. Buyer may, at its expense and prior to closing, obtain a report from a qualified engineer or other person qualified to analyze the existence or nature of any hazardous materials, substances, conditions or wastes located on the Property. In the event any hazardous materials, substances, conditions or wastes are discovered on the Property, Buyer may declare this Agreement null and void, at which time Seller shall immediately refund to Buyer any payments made to Seller under this Agreement. However, in the event Buyer desires to incur expenses in order to remediate or cure environmental hazards at the Property, Seller agrees to use its best efforts to assist Buyer in curing the defects, except that Buyer shall not be required to pay funds directly to Buyer or a third-party in furtherance of its assistance. The expense of any action necessary to remove or otherwise make safe any hazardous material, substances, conditions or waste shall be paid by Buyer, subject to Buyer's right to cancel this Agreement as provided above.
- 12. DEED. At closing, Seller shall convey the Property to Buyer by General Warranty Deed, free and clear of all liens, restrictions, and encumbrances except as provided in this Agreement. General warranties of the title shall extend to the time of delivery of the deed excepting liens and encumbrances suffered or permitted by Buyer.
- 13. LIENS. Buyer specifically does not assume or take subject to a lien on the Property, unless otherwise agreed to in writing signed by the parties.

- 14. REMEDIES OF THE PARTIES. If Buyer fails to timely perform this Agreement, Seller may forfeit it as provided in the Iowa Code (Chapter 656), and all payments made shall be forfeited. Thereafter this Agreement may be foreclosed in equity and the Court may appoint a receiver. If Seller fails to timely perform this Agreement, Buyer has the right to have all payments made returned to it. Buyer and Seller are also entitled to utilize any and all other remedies or actions at law or in equity available to them, and the prevailing parties shall be entitled to obtain judgment for costs and attorney fees.
- 15. NOTICE. Any notice under this Agreement shall be in writing and be deemed served when it is delivered by personal delivery or mailed by regular U.S. mail, addressed to the parties at the addresses provided herein. In addition, Seller shall also send a copy of any notice to Buyer's attorney: David F. Morain, Hoyt, Morain & Hommer, P.C., 101 N. Grimmell Rd., Jefferson, IA 50129.
- 16. GENERAL PROVISIONS. In the performance of each part of this Agreement, time shall be of the essence. Failure to promptly assert rights herein shall not, however, be a waiver of such rights or a waiver of any existing or subsequent default. This Agreement shall apply to and bind the successors in interest of the parties. This Agreement shall survive the closing. This Agreement contains the entire agreement of the parties and shall not be amended except by a written instrument duly signed by Seller and Buyer. Paragraph headings are for convenience of reference and shall not limit or affect the meaning of this Agreement. Words and phrases herein shall be construed as in the singular or plural number, and as masculine, feminine or neuter gender according to the context. This Agreement may be executed by facsimile or photocopied signature at the discretion of the parties, which signature shall carry the full force of an original signature. This Agreement may be entered into in more than one part, for which the combined parts shall be treated as an original.
- 17. NO REAL ESTATE AGENT OR BROKER. Neither party has used the service of a real estate agent or broker in connection with this transaction.
- 18. CERTIFICATION. Buyer and Seller each certify that they are not acting, directly or indirectly, for or on behalf of any person, group, entity or nation named by any Executive Order or the United States Treasury Department as a terrorist, "Specially Designated National and Blocked Person" or any other banned or blocked person, entity, nation or transaction pursuant to any law, order, rule or regulation that is enforced or administered by the Office of Foreign Assets Control; and are not engaged in this transaction, directly or indirectly on behalf of, any such person, group, entity or nation. Each party hereby agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the other party from and against any and all claims, damages, losses, risks, liabilities and expenses (including attorney's fees and costs) arising from or related to my breach of the foregoing certification.
- 19. INSPECTION OF PRIVATE SEWAGE DISPOSAL SYSTEM. Seller represents and warrant to Buyer that the Property is not served by a private sewage disposal system, and there are no known private sewage disposal systems on the property.







(b) Transvestism, transsexualism, pedophilia, exhibitionism, voyeurism, gender identity disorders not resulting from physical impairments or other sexual behavior disorders. (c) Compulsive gambling, kleptomania, or pyromania. (d) Psychoactive substance abuse disorders resulting from current illegal use of drugs.

"State Agency," as defined in Iowa Code 8.11, means a department, board, bureau, commission, or other agency or authority of the State of Iowa.

WHEREAS the Iowa Department of Transportation requires a resolution endorsing the above-mentioned improvements and certifying availability of matching local funds.

WHEREAS a grant application has been prepared on behalf of the City by Bolton & Menk Inc. for the above-mentioned improvements.

WATER/SEWER, STREET/SANITATION COMMITTEE TUESDAY, MAY 17, 2022, 12:00 NOON JEFFERSON CITY HALL

I. SEWER

A. Sewer adjustment request for 603 N Wilson – per statement from customer, there was a pipe that broke in basement and water was pumped out into yard by sump pump. Forgiveness of \$295.56 was approved by committee. Will be placed on council agenda for final approval.

II. WATER

- A. Discussion of Utility Billing was done. Joyce visited Perry Water Works and learned some things that could potentially be beneficial. Many items could possibly cut expenses by far. Joyce to gather more information and present the pros and cons next meeting. Will be placed on next water/sewer committee agenda for June.
- B. Marty gave update on wells #4 the pump as dropped 10 more feet and #10 both wells big water producers for the town. Well #10 cannot be dropped anymore due to it being in bedrock. Marty talked about installing VFD and transducer. With these items, if pumping level gets too low then the VFD will control the motor speed and transducer will keep track of the pump level of water and several other things. Marty to put the wells on a rotation for inspection and acidization. Look for signs of wear and tear and problems that could potentially be fixed before becoming bigger issues.
- C. VFD's were ordered for pumps at plant. Realistically will pay for itself in 3 or 4 years. Marty is checking into two pressure transmitters for inside the plant. This will be for the backwash blower so the system refrains from getting plugged and the other for water distribution. Automatic Systems quoted \$20,000 for repairs to the water tower but due to inflated materials this may have changed. Marty will give updates when available. Work on the water tower will be for future planning in the next several years.

III. STREETS/PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS

- A. East Lincoln Way entry improvement update Mike has been contacting landowners about planting. He said they are doing a zeroscape approach. Mostly river rock bordered by grass, not much for mulch. Trees Forever planted a few trees but mostly ground cover has been planted. The entry way sign – Mark Devilbiss will be putting in the foundation and doing the brick work once the ideal area has been checked for utility interference.
- B. Russell Street plan Jim Leiding updated that the plan will be complete within a few weeks, will go to council in June, bids in July, he said the same for the City Hall front entrance plan. Also, the City Hall front entrance will be closed to persons for possibly several days during this work. There will not be handicap access during this time.
- C. Dennis Murphy has asked for permission to close the street down in front of the new meat market as he will be having several BBQ places coming in to provide BBQ that day free to the community and he will be providing the meat. Committee agreed to grant him this request.

IV. SANITATION/RECYCLING

- A. Waste collection to landfill was 207.58 tons
- B. Recycling collection to Carroll was 23.79 tons
- C. Commercial recycling will continue to next meeting as Matt Wetrich was not in attendance to discuss updates.
