<u>Park Board Membership:</u> Noah Juergensen is recommended to fill a vacancy on the Park Board with the term ending 12-31-26.

<u>Re-zoning KCG Housing Project</u>: The Council will hold a public hearing on the proposed re-zoning of the land south of Ace Hardware from LI to RM3. A representative from KCG will be at the meeting.

Following the public hearing, the Council will consider the ordinance on page 4 to rezone this property. A protest has been filed by adjacent property owners. When a protest is filed fulfilling the requirements as stated in the Zoning Code, "the favorable vote of at least three-fourths of all the members of the Council" (four affirmative votes) is required for passage of the ordinance. This ordinance would need to be passed three times by this super-majority.

<u>Debt Issuance</u>: It is proposed to issue up to \$1.7 million in General Obligation debt to finance the purchase of two sanitation trucks and the East Lincoln Way Street project. It is proposed that these bonds will be repaid over 10 years.

The Council will hold a public hearing on the proposed debt issuance. Following the public hearing, the Council will consider the resolution beginning on page 5 taking action to proceed with the debt issuance.

<u>East Lincoln Way Project</u>: Bolten & Menk's proposed Bidding and Construction Schedule for the East Lincoln Way Resurfacing project is on page 7.

The Bid Letting is set for March 5th at 10:00 am at City Hall and is paper submittal only. The bids will be considered and potentially awarded at the March 12th Council meeting. The substantial completion date is September 27th with final completion by October 25th.

On page 9 is a resolution setting February 27th as the public hearing date on the plans, specification, form of contract, and estimate of costs.

Airport Grant Amendments: The airport hangar project is financed by two federal grants and one state grant. With the addition of the state grant, the percent allocation between the two federal grants changes. The AIP (Airport Infrastructure Program) previously had funded 57.09% of the project. The amendment changes this to 66% of federal funds. The BIL (Bipartisan Infrastructure Legislation) previously had funded 29.06% of the project. The amendment changes this to 34% of federal funds. The project was also awarded a state grant for \$225,000.

This paperwork simply formalizes the new percent allocation for the federal grants. We have been using these new allocation percentages since the project's beginning.

WWTP Pay Application #12 in the amount of \$1,375,826.10 includes:

- Excavation for the lift station and sludge loadout building.
- Below grade exterior process piping
- Concrete pouring and finishing for the anoxic basin.

- Concrete prep and forms for the biosolids loadout building.
- Hatches and doors.
- UV and clarifier equipment, pumps, and pretreatment equipment stored on site.

<u>Golf Course Superintendent</u>: The City proposes to hire Jacob Kopaska as Golf Course Superintendent. The employment agreement begins on page 30. A resolution approving the employment of Jacob is on page 34.

<u>Waiving Review of Plats of Survey</u>: The Council is asked to waive review of a plat in the two-mile area outside of the City limits. The plat is from Shriver Family, LLC.

ORDINANCE NO. ____AN ORDINANCE CHANGING ZONING CLASSIFICATION FOR PROPERTY NORTH OF RAILROAD TRACKS BETWEEN NORTH MAPLE STREET AND NORTH ELM STREET

WHEREAS, pursuant to an application for zoning change made by KCG Development, LLC, and consented to by the owner, SS Properties, LLC, of the property described below the Planning and Zoning Commission has recommended to the City Council that the zoning district classification for the property described below be changed from Light Industrial (LI) District to Residential Multi-Family 3 (RM 3) District under the Jefferson Zoning Regulations; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing on this proposed zoning amendment was held at the regularly scheduled City Council meeting on February 13, 2024, pursuant to notice given in the manner required by law; and

WHEREAS, the City Council feels that it is in the best interests of the City of Jefferson that this zoning change be made.

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Ordained by the City Council of the City of Jefferson, Iowa, as follows:

SECTION 1. Amendment. The zoning classification for the following described property:

Lot 2 of the S 3/4 E 1/2 SE 1/4 SE 1/4 of Section 6, Township 83 North, Range 30 West of the 5th P.M., Greene County, Iowa,

is changed from Light Industrial (LI) District to Residential Multi-Family 3 (RM 3) District.

- SECTION 2. Repealer. Any and all resolutions and ordinances, or parts thereof, in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.
- SECTION 3. Severability. If any section, provision or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 4. When effective. This ordinance shall be in effect after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

RESOLUTION NO.	
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Resolution taking additional action on proposal to enter into a General Obligation Loan Agreement, authorizing the use of a Term Sheet, providing for the levy of taxes, and setting date for the private placement of General Obligation Corporate Purpose Bonds, Series 2024

WHEREAS, the City of Jefferson (the "City"), in Greene County, State of Iowa proposes to enter into a General Obligation Loan Agreement (the "Loan Agreement"), pursuant to the provisions of Section 384.24A of the Code of Iowa, and to borrow money thereunder in a principal amount not to exceed \$1,700,000 for the purpose of purpose of paying the costs, to that extent, of (a) constructing street, water system, sanitary sewer system, storm water drainage and sidewalk improvements; (b) acquiring and installing street lighting, signage and signalization improvements; and (c) acquiring vehicles and equipment for the collection of solid waste; and has published notice of the proposed action and has held a hearing thereon on February 13, 2024; and

WHEREAS, a certain term sheet (the "Term Sheet") will be prepared to facilitate the private placement of General Obligation Corporate Purpose Bonds, Series 2024 (the "Bonds") to be issued in evidence of the obligation of the City under the Loan Agreement, and it is now necessary to make provision for the preparation of the Term Sheet and to authorize its use by Piper Sandler & Co. (the "Placement Agent"); and

WHEREAS, it is now necessary to set the date for the receipt of proposals for the private placement of the Bonds and to authorize the Placement Agent to negotiate such proposals for private placement; and

WHEREAS, the City intends to enter into the Loan Agreement in the future and to issue the Bonds and anticipates that principal and interest will come due on the Bonds before July 1, 2025; and

WHEREAS, it is now necessary to make provision for the levy of a debt service property tax in the 2024-2025 fiscal year for the payment of such anticipated principal and interest;

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Resolved by the City Council of the City of Jefferson, Iowa, as follows:

- Section 1. The City Council hereby determines to enter into the Loan Agreement in the future and orders that the Bonds be issued at such time, in evidence thereof. The City Council further declares that this resolution constitutes the "additional action" required by Section 384.24A of the Code of Iowa.
- Section 2. The City staff are hereby authorized to take such action as shall be deemed necessary and appropriate, with the assistance of the Placement Agent, to prepare and use the Term Sheet describing the Bonds and providing for the terms and conditions of its placement and to receive proposals for the private placement of the Bonds, and all action heretofore taken in this regard is hereby ratified and approved.



- Section 3. The City staff are hereby authorized to take such action as shall be deemed necessary and appropriate, with assistance from Dorsey & Whitney, LLP and the Placement Agent, to set the date of March 12, 2024 as the date for the receipt of proposals for the placement of the Bonds to be issued in evidence of the City's obligation under the Loan Agreement.
- Section 4. For the purpose of providing for the levy and collection of a direct annual tax sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on the Bonds as the same become due, there is hereby ordered levied on all the taxable property in the City the following direct annual tax:

For collection in the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2024, sufficient to produce the net annual sum of \$147,150.

provided, however, that at the time the Bonds are issued, the actual tax levy amounts required to pay the principal of and interest on the Bonds in each year shall be determined based upon the interest rate or rates at which the Bonds are issued, and this resolution shall be supplemented by a resolution of the City Council to provide for such actual and necessary tax levy amounts.

- Section 5. A certified copy of this resolution shall be filed with the Greene County Auditor and said Auditor is hereby instructed to enter for collection and assess the tax hereby authorized. When annually entering such taxes for collection, the County Auditor shall include the same as a part of the tax levy for Debt Service Fund purposes of the City and when collected, the proceeds of the taxes shall be converted into the Debt Service Fund of the City and set aside therein as a special account to be used solely and only for the payment of the principal of and interest on the Bonds hereby authorized and for no other purpose whatsoever.
- Section 6. All resolutions or parts thereof in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.
- Section 7. This resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its adoption and approval, as provided by law.

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A RESOLUTION SETTING DATE FOR PUBLIC HEARING ON DETAILED PLANS AND SPECIFICATIONS, FORM OF CONTRACT, AND ESTIMATE OF COST FOR THE JEFFERSON EAST LINCOLN WAY RESURFACING PROJECT AND SETTING DATE FOR RECEIVING BIDS

WHEREAS, the City Council of Jefferson previously directed Bolton & Menk, Inc. (the "Project Engineer") to prepare plans and specifications for the Jefferson East Lincoln Way Resurfacing Project (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Project Engineer has prepared detailed plans and specifications, a form of contract, and an estimate of cost for the Project, all on file in the office of the City Clerk; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to fix a time and place of public hearing on the proposed plans and specifications, form of contract, and estimate of cost for the Project and to set a date for receiving bids.

NOW, THEREFORE, It Is Resolved by the City Council of the City of Jefferson, Iowa, as follows:

- Section 1. The Council determines that it is advisable to proceed with the Project, and subject to final approval after public hearing, the detailed plans and specifications, form of contract, and estimate of cost for the Project are hereby tentatively approved.
- Section 2. The City Council sets February 27, 2024, at 5:30 p.m., at the Jefferson Municipal Center, Jefferson, Iowa, as the time and place of hearing on the proposed plans and specifications, form of contract and estimate of cost for the Project.
- Section 3. The City Clerk shall publish notice of hearing on the proposed plans and specifications, form of contract, and estimate of cost for the Project, which publication shall be made in a legal newspaper of general circulation in the City of Jefferson, which publication shall be not less than 4 days nor more than 20 days before the date set for hearing.
- Section 4. The City Council sets March 5, 2024, at 10:00 a.m., at the Jefferson Municipal Center, Jefferson, Iowa, as the deadline and place to receive bids for the Project, all bids to be received by paper submittal only, and the City Council delegates to the City Administrator, the City Clerk and the Project Engineer (each with authority to act alone) the duty of receiving, opening, and announcing the results of all bids for the Project, to tabulate the same, and to present the same to the City Council at its next meeting for action thereon.
- Section 5. The City Council sets the amount of security to accompany each bid to be in the amount of 5% of the total bid, price pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 26 of the Code of Iowa, which bid security shall conform to the provisions of the Instructions to Bidders hereby approved.
- Section 6. The Mayor, City Administrator and City Clerk are authorized to take such further action as may be necessary to carry out the intent and purpose of this resolution.

Section 7. All resolutions and orders, or parts thereof, in conflict herewith are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby repealed, and this resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its adoption and approval.

EMPLOYMENT AGREEMENT

THIS EMPLOYMENT AGREEMENT (the "Agreement") is made as of February 1, 2024, by and between the **City of Jefferson**, an Iowa municipal corporation, the address of which is 220 North Chestnut, Jefferson, Iowa 50129 (the "City"), and **Jacob Kopasta**, an individual with an address of 623 6th Ave., Coon Rapids, IA 50058 (hereinafter referred to as "Employee"), both who agree as follows:

WHEREAS, the City desires to employ Employee as the City's Golf Course Superintendent of the Jefferson Community Golf Course, and

WHEREAS, Employee desires to accept such employment and to perform such services; and

WHEREAS, the City and Employee wish to establish in writing the terms and conditions of said employment and the means for terminating said employment if either party desires to do so.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE PARTIES AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. Employment Duties. The City employs Employee as Golf Course Superintendent to perform the functions and duties of Golf Course Superintendent as specified in Exhibit A attached hereto. Employee shall report directly to the Golf Course Manager, which for the purposes of this Agreement shall be Dave Morlan, although the City may change the identity of the Golf Course Manager from time to time during the term of this Agreement. The position of Golf Course Superintendent is a "Regular Part-Time" position as defined by the City's Personnel Handbook, but Employee will devote sufficient time to complete all of the duties listed on Exhibit A. It is anticipated that most of the duties outlined on Exhibit A will be performed from March through November.
- 2. <u>Term.</u> The term of employment under this Agreement, subject to the termination provisions herein, shall commence on February 1, 2024, and end on January 31, 2025.
- 3. <u>Salary</u>; <u>Hours</u>. The City agrees to pay Employee for his services under this Agreement an annual salary of \$54,000.00, payable in installments at the same time as other employees of the City, which payments shall be subject to normal withholding for applicable taxes. Employee shall keep and report a time sheet of hours worked and submit them every two weeks to the Golf Course Manager. If Employee has worked total hours that equal more than 1,660 hours during the Term once all of Employee's time cards are totaled, employee shall be paid those additional hours at a rate of \$32.53/hour.
- 4. <u>Review</u>. City shall review and evaluate Employees' job performance and compensation as needed, in City's sole determination, during the term of this Agreement.

- 5. <u>Termination</u>. (a) Employee understands that he serves as Golf Course Superintendent of the City of Jefferson at the pleasure of the City Council and that notwithstanding any other provision of this Agreement the City has and shall continue to have the right to terminate the employment of Employee at any time with or without cause. This employment contract may be renewed upon review each year at a time after its extension. Neither the City nor the Employee shall have any obligation to renew this contract for any additional terms after the expiration of the initial term as renewals will require specific action on the part of the City and Employee. Employee will serve at the will of the Council and may be terminated with or without cause at any time, but subject to due process requirements of Iowa Code Section 372.15.
- 6. <u>Benefits</u>. In addition to the salary provided in this Agreement, Employee will be eligible for IPERS retirement benefits. As a part-time employee of the City, Employee will not be eligible for vacation, holidays or other leave. Employee is not eligible for health insurance or sick leave. Employee will provide his own transportation, at his sole expense, to and from his job duties.
- 7. <u>Miscellaneous</u>. This Agreement contains the entire understanding between the parties and there are no other agreements between the parties, oral or written, pertaining to the employment relationship between the City and Employee. No term or provision of this Agreement shall be construed or interpreted to require either party to extend or renew the term provided for herein. This Agreement may only be modified, amended, or extended by an additional agreement signed by the parties or by resolution of the City Council countersigned by the Employee. This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties, their heirs, personal representatives, successors, and assigns. If any provision, or any portion thereof, of this Agreement, is held to be invalid, unconstitutional, or unenforceable, the remainder of this Agreement, or portion thereof, shall be deemed severable and shall remain in full force and effect. This Agreement shall be contingent upon approval and ratification of the City Council.

EXHIBIT A

Employment Duties

Under broad supervision from Golf Course Manager, provides maintenance of the municipal golf course grounds, facilities and equipment. Superintendent shall be generally responsible for organizing, managing and performing the day to day maintenance and upkeep of the Golf Course, other than the clubhouse, which shall include without limitation the following:

- 1) Keep greens, fairways and tee areas properly watered and mowed and keep the Golf Course in a neat and clean condition;
- 2) Apply, or arrange for the application of, fertilizer and chemicals as required to keep the Golf Course in top condition and consult with other golf course professionals and turf management specialists as may be reasonably required to obtain advice as to the proper timing and rates of chemical and fertilizer application;
- 3) Reseed greens, fairways and tee areas as needed;
- 4) Identify and control weeds, pests, and turf diseases and disorders;
- 5) Maintain trees and shrubs:
- 6) Change pins and tee boxes;
- 7) Mark hazards, out of bounds and ground under repair;
- 8) Maintain bunkers;
- 9) Monitor, inspect, maintain and operate the irrigation system so as to keep it in good operating condition, and arrange for the irrigation system to be properly shut down and winterized at the end of the season so as to prevent damage from freezing;
- 10) Monitor, inspect, maintain and regulate the storm water management system along the south and west sides of the Golf Course, including without limitation the levee and water gates, so as to minimize flooding of the Golf Course, and to promptly report to the Golf Course Manager any repairs needed to the system;
- 11) Cooperate with Golf Course Manager in the scheduling of mowing and related turf management activities so as to accommodate and prepare for tournaments and special events;
- 12) Coordinate and cooperate with the Public Works Director in the purchase of fertilizer, chemicals and other supplies and the hiring of subcontractors needed for the operation of the Golf Course;
- 13) Keep the cart shed in a neat and clean condition and organized for the storage of golf carts by patrons, and help assure that City owned golf carts are ready for use by patrons;

- 14) Use and operate City owned equipment provided in a safe, reasonable, and responsible manner so as to prevent excessive wear and tear to such equipment, keep such equipment clean, perform routine maintenance and repairs as may be needed to preserve and keep such equipment in good operating condition, and promptly report to the Public Works Director, or his designee, issues or problems with such equipment that require more than minimal maintenance;
- 15) Communicate with and be receptive to comments from members and patrons as to the condition of the Golf Course, and inform the Golf Course Manager of any planned changes or maintenance activities which may affect the use or condition of the Golf Course;
- 16) Promptly report to the Golf Course Manager any known issues or problems involving the Golf Course;
- 17) Perform such other duties and activities as may be reasonably required by the City.
