Regular City Council Session Tuesday, July 22, 2025 5:30 p.m.

<u>Car Show:</u> Cruisin' to the Square will be held on Thursday, August 14th. Enclosed is an aerial photo showing the requested street closures. The Street Committee recommends approval of this request.

<u>Sidewalk Reimbursement</u>: A sidewalk was replaced at 204 N. West Street. The amount of the City's sidewalk grant to these projects is \$2,000.

<u>Sensibly Chic</u>: There is an investor planning to purchase the Sensibly Chic building. They had a \$150,000 forgivable loan on the building. According to our records, Sensibly Chic ceased operation and finalized their liquidation sale in April, 2023. Based on that date, the amount outstanding on their forgivable loan is \$67,500. Tucker's have requested to count the months in which they have had special events in the store toward the amount forgiven. This includes such things as special markets, Barbie by the Bells, etc.

The Tuckers have requested to settle at \$60,000. The Downtown Buildings Committee agrees with the proposal to settle at \$60,000. A resolution authorizing this action is enclosed.

OPTION 2: Yesterday, Nikki Ubell received interest in the building from another person to place a retail business in the building. If this leads toward a possible purchase, the resolution will likely be removed from Tuesday's agenda.


<u>Airport Grants</u>: The City has received contracts for two grants for the Airport Fuel Farm. The Airport Improvement Program (AIP) grant is for 300,000. The IIJA grant is for \$281,000. The contracts were e-mailed as separate files.

The project is funded by AIP grants and IIJA grants for the current year and next year. Enclosed is a spreadsheet showing the funding break-out.

The Council will consider two separate resolutions approving these grants.

A RESOLUTION APPROVING PARTIAL AMOUNT TOWARDS A FORGIVABLE LOAN AND AUTHORIZING FORGIVENESS OF REMAINING LOAN BALANCE FOR 111 E LINCOLN WAY

WHEREAS, the City of Jefferson, Iowa (the "City"), pursuant to Resolutions 4-17 and 7-17 previously entered into an Agreement for Sale and Redevelopment of Property dated February 17, 2017 (the "Agreement") with Raymond and Rosemary Tucker (the "Borrowers"). The Agreement provided for the sale of 111 E Lincoln Way (the "Property") to the Borrowers and that the City would provide financial assistance to the Borrowers to develop and improve the Property for the purpose of opening a new business in exchange for the Borrowers forgivable notes and other covenants in the Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the Agreement further provided for forgivable loans given by the City to the Borrowers for \$45,000.00 for the purchase price of the Property and \$105,000.00 for improvements to be made (together the "Forgivable Loans"). The loans as evidenced by notes and mortgages by the Borrowers were to be forgivable in 10 equal annual installments starting on October 1, 2018, and each October first thereafter, under the condition that the Borrowers remain in business and own the property for the duration of the 10 years; and

WHEREAS, the Borrowers' business closed permanently in the spring of 2023 and the now are seeking to sell the Property to another party. The forgivable portion of the loans prorated during the Borrowers business operations (2017 – 2023) represents \$90,000.00. The Borrower has fulfilled all conditions required under the Agreement thus far and requests the City to accept \$60,000.00 as partial payment on the Forgivable Loans and in full satisfaction of the Agreement and notes and release of the mortgages issued by Borrowers; and

WHEREAS, The City has reviewed the Borrower's compliance and recommends approval of the partial payment and forgiveness of the remaining loan balance.

NOW, THEREFORE, It Is Resolved by the City Council of the City of Jefferson, Iowa, as follows:

- 1. Approval of Partial Payment. The City hereby accepts the Borrower's amount towards the Forgivable Loans in the amount of \$60,000.00 towards the principal balance of the loans, to be paid on or before the time of closing on the sale of the Property.
- 2. Forgiveness of Remaining Balance. The City hereby forgives the remaining balance of \$90,000.00 on the Forgivable Loans, pursuant to the terms of the Agreement.
- Section 1. The Council further finds that a public purpose was reasonably accomplished thus far by entering into the Agreement and providing the Forgivable Loans to Borrowers.
- Section 2. The partial amount towards a Forgivable Loans and authorizing forgiveness of the remaining loan balances is hereby approved and the Mayor and City Clerk are hereby authorized and directed to execute such documents and to take such actions as may be necessary to carry out the provisions of the Agreement and this Resolution.
